Applicants (male or female) must be a member of the Greek Orthodox Church and related to a Philoptochos member. Ignoring instructions may disqualify your application.

- 1. Complete the entire application available on the Metropolis website: www.detroit.goarch.org.
- 2. Include a Letter of Recommendation from a non-relative who will write of your character, ideals and values. It could be a priest, teacher or anyone who knows you well and can address these aspects of your character. It is recommended that you limit the letter to one page in length.
- 3. Statement of Orthodoxy indicating that the applicant is a practicing Orthodox Christian and a U.S. resident.
- 4. Statement of Stewardship from the Parish Priest certifying that the applicant or the applicant's family are Stewards in good standing in a Metropolis of Detroit parish.
- 5. Include all supporting documents required of the application.
